








History of NSBE

- In 1971, 2 undergraduates at Purdue University (Edward Barnette Jr. and Fred Cooper) launched a new campus organization, the Black Society of Engineers (BSE).
- In 1973, led by the "Chicago Six" (Edward A. Coleman, Anthony Harris, Brian Harris, Stanley L. Kirtley, John W. Logan Jr. and George A. Smith) the BSE changed its name to the Society of Black Engineers (SBE). A year later, an effort was launched to create a national organization.
- On April 10–12, 1975 at Purdue University, the SBE organized the first national conference, where 134 students from 28 schools gathered and formed the National Society of Black Engineers (NSBE).









History of NSBE

- John Cason was elected as first National Chairperson during the national conference.
- The NSBE logo was chosen at the first national conference to represent the organization.
 - The torch symbolizes members' everlasting, burning desire to achieve success in a competitive society and positively affect the quality of life for all people.
 - The lightning bolt represents the striking impact that will be felt by the society and industry due to the contributions and accomplishments made by the dedicated members of the National Society of Black Engineers.










History of NSBE

- NSBE was divided into 6 regions during the first national conference. The regions were formed based on geographical location.
 - Florida is in Region III
- In 1976, NSBE was incorporated as a nonprofit organization in the State of Texas. NSBE also became recognized as a tax-exempt organization under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- The UF chapter of NSBE was established in 1976.
- NSBE has since grown from six to over 31,000 members and the annual meeting has blossomed into the Annual National Convention, hosting over 8,000 attendees. NSBE has 99 active NSBE Jr. pre-college, 250 student and 68 professional chapters.


Scavenger Hunt


Fall Regional Conference(FRC)






