PROGRAM

Students on this program will have the chance to learn about the nature of computer science and global engineering as well as acquire practical skills in computer science innovation for social good. The 6-credit curriculum and internship will see students work with local community organizations in Cape Town. Students will work for 6 weeks with local community organizations and interact with leaders in top tech companies. Students will collaborate directly with the clients in order to determine their needs, design a cutting-edge technological product, create a prototype, and demonstrate the solution. They will thereby gain proficiency in computer science, as well as communication skills for non-technical audiences.

LOCATION

South Africa is a country located on the southernmost tip of the African continent. Like many other African countries, South Africa is home to varied people groups, cultures, and religious belief systems; for this reason, it is often called the "Rainbow Nation". It is also geographically rich and varied, comprising 8 different biomes that are spread across the country, and is home to a spectacular array of plant, mammal, and bird species.

EXCURSIONS

Excursions include, but are not limited to: the District Six Museum, the Bo-Kaap (Upper Cape Town) walking experience, Cape Malay cooking experience, cable car ride up to the iconic Table Mountain to take in the breathtaking views, gorgeous vineyards, Hippo Boat Cruise and 1-day Safari (Kwazulu Natal) and more.

HOUSING

Students will stay in shared rooms at Wunderlux Apartments. Wunderlux is situated in Green Point, less than a mile from the famed V&A Waterfront. Complimentary breakfast is included. Grocery stores, restaurants, and other stores are within close walking distance.

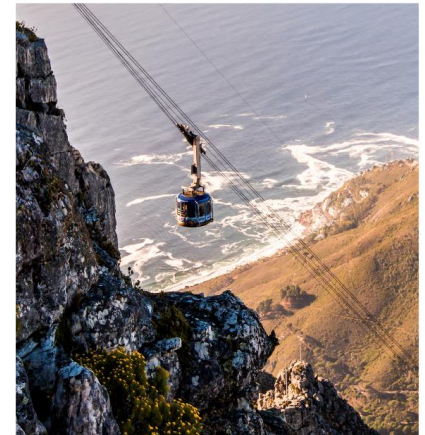

PROGRAM

This program offers a one-week experiential learning opportunity for students to participate in a hackathon in Ireland. During the event, students will collaborate with local university peers to create solutions focused on AI and sustainability. They will face the challenge of rapid development with an emphasis on global AI technology and gain experience in teamwork, collaboration, leadership, and innovation. They will have the chance to develop a software application that addresses AI for Social Good and contributes to global awareness and sustainable literacy by tackling one or more of the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Students will learn about global AI, engineering, computer science, and design thinking from an international perspective.

LOCATION

Blending a high-energy, multinational professional culture with traditional Irish warmth and hospitality, Dublin has sprawling parks, cosy cafés and quirky restaurants for the daytime, with classic pubs, fashionable clubs, music gigs and theatre by night. Dublin is not just a vibrant capital city, it is an international centre of excellence for business, culture and the arts. Dublin was also ranked in the world's top twenty student cities in 2017 in the 'student mix' category, reflecting its high concentration of students and ratio of international students.

EXCURSIONS

On their first day, students will take a walking tour of Dublin to learn about their host city. Throughout the week, students will get to visit important sites, such as the EPIC Museum and Guinness Storehouse. One night there will be a traditional Irish music session where students can learn classic dances and music.

HOUSING

Students will share quad bedrooms with an en-suite bathroom at a local hostel.

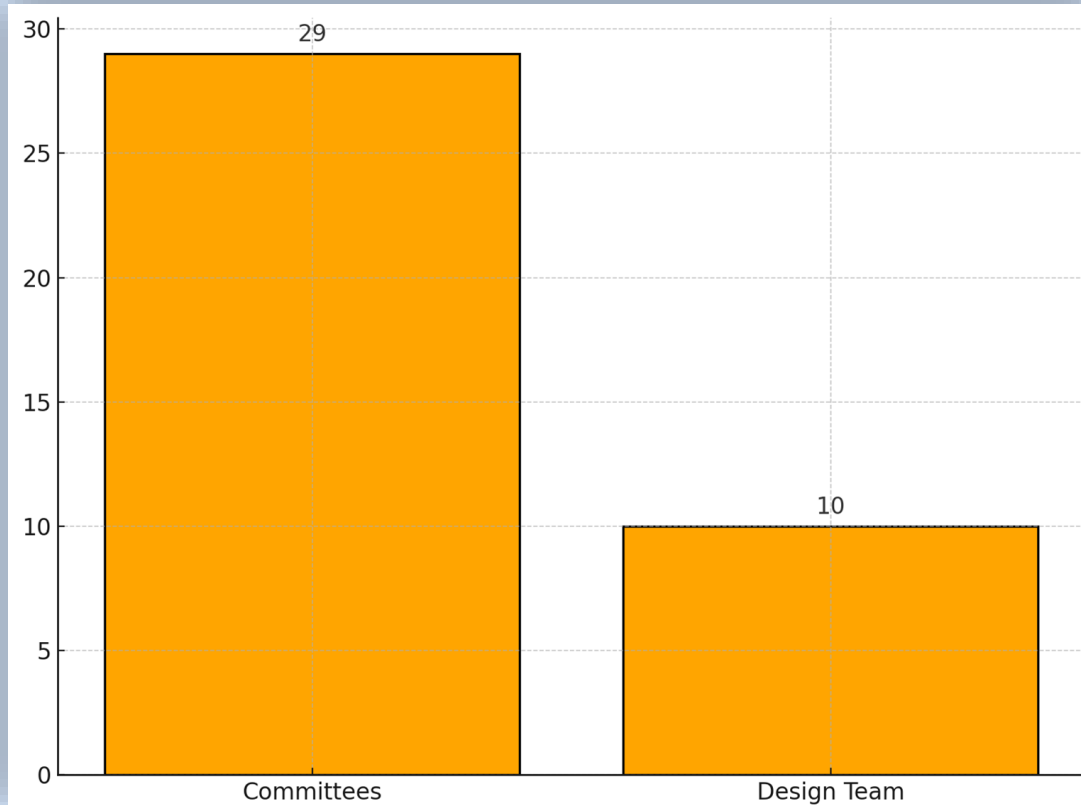
NSBE STATS: MAJOR
