





National Convention History

Inception and Early Years

1975

 Forty-eight students from 32 colleges met at Purdue University for NSBE's first conference, deciding on the organization's name, torch symbol, and initial constitution.

1976-1980s

 Conferences in Pomona, Atlanta, Columbus, and Philadelphia reinforced NSBE's structure, expanded its membership, and tackled the challenges facing Black engineering students.

Expansion & Professional Development

• 1990s

- The conventions leveled up with more professional development sessions, workshops, and technical presentations.
- Career fairs became a hallmark, putting members in direct contact with potential employers.

1997

- NSBE broke new ground as the first minority organization to serve as lead sponsor for National Engineers Week.
- Hip-hop legend KRS-ONE even led a workshop, spotlighting NSBE's commitment to blending culture with professional growth.



Technological Integration & Global Reach

2000s

- Adopted digital platforms for networking, e-learning, and virtual collaboration
- Founded the NSBE International Committee, sparking the launch of chapters worldwide
- Broadened NSBE's global scope and membership reach

2010

- Hosted the 36th Annual Convention in Toronto—the first held outside the U.S.
- Solidified NSBE's status as a truly international force in engineering

Recent Developments

2024

 50th Annual Convention relocated from Orlando to Atlanta amid anti-DEI legislation. Broke attendance records with 18,000+ participants, reinforcing NSBE's DEI commitment.

2025

 51st Annual Convention held in Chicago, NSBE's founding city. Drew 15,000+ attendees, 400+ Career Fair exhibitors, and showcased the organization's ongoing growth and impact.







CEO Positions

President

- Shall preside over all meetings of this chapter and provide an agenda for each member at each regular meeting.
- Shall serve as representative of this chapter.
- Shall appoint and remove all chairpersons and members of all committees, with the advice and consent of the Executive Committee.

Vice President

- Shall preside in the absence or the inability of the President.
- Shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to her by the President.
- Manage all Chapter Executive Board members.
 - Presides over Membership Zone

Secretary

- Shall keep accurate minutes of each meeting.
- In charge of room bookings and social media platforms.
- Presides over Communications Zone.

CEO Positions

Treasurer

- Shall keep an accurate account of the Chapter's funds.
- Shall maintain a membership roll and collect all dues of the Chapter members.
- Shall be responsible for obtaining and/or maintaining a bank account in the name of this Chapter.
- Presides over Finance Zone

Programs Chair

- Responsible for planning and implementing NSBE programs and may delegate certain responsibilities to zone members.
- Encourage members to participate in chapter activities by appealing to the program's ability to develop the member and the chapter.
 - Presides over Programs Zone

CEO Positions

Parliamentarian

- Shall ensure that Parliamentary Procedure is observed and executed properly.
- Assist in maintaining order at all meetings.
- Shall keep an accurate record of membership and attendance at Chapter meetings.
- Understand and enforce procedures as related to the National Constitution, Region III Bylaws, and Chapter Constitution
- Conduct nomination and election processes and ensure quality candidates contest positions.
- Enforces the Disciplinary/Misconduct system
- Presides over Senate Zone

Trailblazers Advisor

- This position is required to have held a director position in the previous school year.
- Responsible for overseeing the Trailblazers directors and making sure their duties are being accomplished.
- Acts as a liaison between the Trailblazer directors and elected officers of the Gator Chapter of NSBE.

Nomination Process

- Each CEO position will be introduced by the Parliamentarian.
 - General Body Members may nominate ONLY CEB members for each position as they are introduced.
 - A nomination must be second by another member to be accepted.
 - The person nominated can choose to accept or decline the nomination.
- If a current CEO is running for position they are not allowed to be involved in the election process.
- People cannot run for more than one position, if they are nominated for more than one they must choose.

 - You can use gestures, facial expressions, and body movements







Recap of LBL Session 1


- Introduced participants to NSBE's leadership structure, teamwork, and event planning.

- Covered event planning fundamentals, including logistics, budgeting, marketing, and execution.








PCI Shadow Day Planning Committee
